These are entered into a weekly raffle on Monday Community meetings. Classrooms can earn Kernel awards to encourage and recognize positive behavior at a classroom level. Classrooms can earn a movie and popcorn party. <u>Little Dragons</u> Outstanding students are chosen by their classroom teacher to be recognized by the Principal. <u>Spirit Days</u> Every Friday, dress up in our school colors, school apparel, play(theater) shirts. <u>Dragon Day Share Out</u> Celebrate Golden Dragons, ultimate PBIS award, artistic talents of our students, academic and attendance success! ENCOURAGE your child to ALWAYS follow the HONORABLE DRAGON CODE and start being positive!
